Generational Impact

HOW THE IMPACT YOU MAKE TODAY HAS RIPPLE EFFECTS LONG INTO THE FUTURE

Penny had a tough start in life – far from her poised presence witnessed on stage at this year's Soirée. Her childhood was marred by physical and emotional abuse from her mother and when her parents separated in 1982, Penny chose to remain in Calgary with her dad. This change brought some welcomed relief, but not long after, things took another distressing turn with the introduction of her stepmother, Gladys.

In this new family dynamic, Penny suffered further abuse, including assaults by her stepmother, neighbourhood boys, and others 'welcomed' into the house. After bravely telling her dad about what was happening to her, he tried to protect her by sending her to live with her grandmother in Ontario. However, this attempt at safety led to further abuse in a place where she thought she'd be cared for.

With few options left, Penny returned to Calgary. Once again, she found herself living with Gladys but was eventually kicked out. At the time, Penny was just 15 years old.

Miraculously, she found her way to the doors of Avenue 15 – Trellis' Emergency Youth Shelter.

With the support of Trellis, her journey to healing began. Unbeknownst to Penny, Gladys had actively worked to keep her dad from knowing where she was. But Trellis staff worked tirelessly to reunite her with him and this marked the turning point in their lives.

Once reunited, Penny and her father moved into a basement apartment – just the two of them. They created a new life, a home and a community. After

graduating high school, Penny relocated to Ontario but continued to grow from the foundation that's built when you know you are loved and cared for by the people in your life.

In 1996, Penny achieved her dream of becoming a police officer, breaking barriers as the first female officer for the Rama Police Service. She pursued higher education, earning a Bachelor of Human Services and a Master's in Public Safety, with honours. Throughout her remarkable career, Penny has specialized in investigations related to human trafficking, sexual assault, murdered and missing Indigenous women and crimes against children. For her service, Penny has been honoured with two Distinguished Service Medals as well as an Order of Merit.

Today, Constable Penny's proudest achievement is being the mother to seven children and foster mom to one more. Her family is flourishing, with her children pursuing university education and growing into their full potential. Her children were given the chance to thrive, benefiting from the nurturing environment that was absent in Penny's own upbringing, thanks to her resilience and the support of Trellis. This is generational change.

Penny acknowledges that the impact she is making would not have been possible without the support she received at Avenue 15 all those years ago. Trellis' presence during her darkest days put her on a new path, empowering her to help transform the lives of others. Penny's journey is a testament to her strength and the impact that Trellis and people like you can have for generations to come.
